# Nature-based Solutions in Practice: Insights, Inclusion & Impact

#### **PROGRAMME**

Nature-based Solutions (NbS) are increasingly integrated into climate change adaptation and disaster risk reduction (DRR) efforts, yet practitioners often face unclear definitions, unrealistic expectations, and limited guidance on implementation. This event invites a grounded conversation on what NbS can—and cannot—achieve in real-world contexts. Together, we will explore practical examples, discuss how to ensure inclusivity and tangible local benefits, and unpack the challenges of financing and sustaining NbS over time. With a focus on applied insights, this event aims to support practitioners in navigating the complexities of designing and delivering effective, equitable, and context-specific NbS interventions.

Are you supporting and implementing projects and programmes related to climate change and disaster risk reduction, with an interest in learning and exchanging on the importance of NbS for climate and disaster resilience?

Join us to share and learn from existing experience of platform member organizations and their partners, as well as other organizations and stakeholders involved with NbS in the development and humanitarian contexts.

In **4 online thematic sessions** we will get an introduction to NbS, explore the applicability of NbS in displacement settings, discuss scientific evidence for NbS, and get familiarized with a new Valuation Guideline to evaluate NbS.

At the **annual event** on Friday afternoon, we will explore pathways for localizing NbS, focusing on key drivers for success from different perspectives. We bring together distinguished panel guests from the public and private sector, NGOs, and academia.

### **Objectives**

With the learning days and the annual event, our aim is to bring together **NGO practitioners and all** interested professionals involved in planning and implementing **NbS**, promote exchange and learning on the topic, and discuss good practices and opportunities creating co-benefits for people and nature.

#### Thematic sessions

Several thematic sessions aim to answer frequently asked questions and encourage reflection on challenges and opportunities that NGOs may face when working in the field of NbS. Although mainly addressing NGO practitioners, these sessions are open to all interested parties and will combine experiences from different stakeholders to paint a comprehensive picture and strengthen capacities towards successful implementation.

All thematic sessions will take place online, and most will have simultaneous translation into English, French and Spanish. You can participate in all or select sessions of your interest.

All sessions will be recorded and uploaded on our Youtube channel.

#### Annual event

To conclude the learning days, the annual event of the Swiss NGO DRR Platform will bring together a broad audience in-person in Bern. Speakers will reflect on how different sectors (donors, academia, private sector, NGOs) can support local communities in planning, implementing and maintaining Nature-based Solutions with lasting benefits for both nature and people.

The annual event will be held in Bern, Switzerland, in English.

Nature-based Solutions promise multiple benefits for climate change adaptation, disaster risk reduction, and ecosystem health but how can we effectively assess their true value and compare NbS with infrastructure-based and hybrid solutions? This session introduces a practical guide developed by the Swiss NGO DRR Platform to help development actors value NbS with a focus on climate and disaster resilience, equity, and livelihoods. Drawing on case studies —presenting one in Tajikistan—and expert insights from IISD, IUCN and implementing partners, we will explore a multidimensional valuation approach and tools, challenges in capturing the whole range of co-benefits and costs, and how insights can inform project design, implementation and adaptive management, and help avoid maladaptation.
